










Pond Scavenger Hunt

How to make a frog from a paper plate



Supplies: Paper plate
Crayons or paint (green and red)
Red paper (optional)
Paper blower
Styrofoam ball (about 2 inches) or 2 large cotton balls (or large marshmallows)
Wiggly eyes
Glue or glue gun

1. Color or paint the outside/bottom of the paper plate green.
2. Glue the red circle to the center of the unpainted side of the plate or color it red.
3. Fold the plate in half so the red is on the inside.
4. Cut the Styrofoam ball in $\frac{1}{2}$. Glue the $\frac{1}{2}$ Styrofoam balls to the green side of the plate. These are the eyes.
5. Glue the wiggly eyes to the Styrofoam balls.
6. Cut a slit in the center of the plate along the fold. Insert the tongue (red party blowout) through the slit in the plate.
7. Your frog is ready to try to catch flies!
